

## **Example 2. Regional Regeneration Grants.**

Our community fund, ROR4Good, supports economic regeneration in the area covered by RORhub's frameworks. It is funded by donations of cash or benefits in kind from contractors and consultants when they're awarded projects through our frameworks.

ROR4Good provides grants of up to £10,000 to community groups to support local economic regeneration projects. Projects can also be implemented directly by contractors while they are on site.

### **Who can apply?**

ROR4Good accepts applications from groups located within the area covered by RORhub's frameworks. Applications must be sponsored by users of the frameworks or contractors appointed to them, and their projects must contribute to one or more of RORhub key themes. These are:

### **Employment and Skills**

- Potentially enhances the opportunity for people to gain employment through the activities they will be undertaking
- Provides an environment for people to learn new skills, promoting education, health and wellbeing

### **Sustainability**

- Enhances the longevity of the organisation by increasing the opportunity for membership and/or reducing operational costs
- Reduces the organisation's impact on the environment
- Contributes to or enhances the environment in the community

### **Economic regeneration**

- Revitalises a community asset

### **How to apply**

All applications are to be made through the grant application portal. Just register to apply for and submit your application. Applications are invited up to two times per year. The current round of funding is open from December xxxx to March xxxx

The grant shall not be used to:

Make any payment to members of its Governing Body

Purchase buildings or land

Pay for any expenditure commitments already entered into before the grant award

All applications must be sponsored by a registered framework user or contractor. A list of users and contractors can be found on pages xxxxx. The sponsor is required to collaborate in the application process and sign a declaration, supporting the project identified. The sponsor does not

have any responsibility for the delivery, or financial support of the proposed project. Their role is to assist with linking the scheme with the YORhub frameworks and the ROR4Good

fund key themes. It will not be possible to submit the application without the Sponsor Declaration.

To expedite this requirement, please contact your proposed sponsor prior to your request to ensure their support and participation.

The fund can provide donations in the form of benefit in kind (labour / materials), cash or any combination thereof; to a maximum value of £10,000 per project. Only 1 application can be made per project; however a client or contractor can sponsor multiple projects. All projects must commence on-site within 6 months of the application approval and be completed within 12 months.

Applicants that bid for full or partial Benefit In-Kind donations on page one of the application, may have a greater chance of the application being successful.

Should the application be successful and where deemed necessary, appropriate levels of insurance are to be held for the project and demonstrated accordingly. Any insurance held should include cover for any assets bought or rented as well as any events or activities being held. Obtaining the appropriate insurance is the sole responsibility of the applicant.

Any personal data submitted as part of an application will be held in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulations 2018.

Before your application is assessed, your organisation or sponsored organisation, may be subject to a credit check using Creditsafe (or equivalent) where possible and/or may be required to submit one year of accounts. If your organisation fails the credit check or there are concerns with the submitted

accounts the application is unlikely to be successful
